



MISSIONARY HIGHLIGHT: September 8, 2019

Charlotte, N.C.

We know Charlotte is North Carolina's largest city, but we may not think about Charlotte as a missions challenge.

More than 2 million people now live in and around Charlotte, and many of those residents have come from other lands. For example, more than 100,000 Hispanics, or about 13 percent of the city's population, now live in Charlotte.

Today we want to pray for one of our church planters who is reaching many of those Hispanics in Charlotte. We will pray for him because we are helping support him financially through our church's Cooperative Program giving.

His name is Oscar Muñoz (say MOON-yoze). He is from Chile, in South America, but now he is pastor of a new church called Alpha and Omega Christian Church which is located southwest of downtown Charlotte.

After three years, there are more than 50 members who come from a dozen or so Spanish-speaking countries in Central and South America.

We have helped train Oscar in two ways: Through our Baptist state convention's church planter training and also through classes he has taken at Fruitland Baptist Bible College, which provides teaching in Spanish at their Charlotte location. Note that we also support Fruitland through our Cooperative Program giving.

Today, let us pray for our brother in Christ, our missionary Oscar, and his ministry there in our state's biggest mission field with our biggest language group.
